Sierra Leone is a country on the southwest coast of West Africa. Nearly 8 million people live here.


This is Hands on Africa's orphanage, in Sierra Leone!

This is Hands on Africa's orphanage, in Kenya!




This is Zambia's flag!

It is their natural home.


There are a lot of poor people in Africa and many cannot afford to go to school.





Some poor families live in slum areas, their homes are close together and are made out of mud.




